Only £4 a month, will help educate a child at the HAPC Gambia Village School

From a little acorn, grows a fully operational school, thanks to your generous support.

Back in May 2012, HAPC began a trial exercise in Jarra Soma, a village in The Gambia, West Africa. Families in this village had never before seen a school because the nearest one is some 20 miles away in the city. So, essentially, nobody from the village went to school.

Therefore, using land given to the Charity by a concerned village elder, HAPC built this classroom (below) and initially enrolled 10 children to begin studying in September 2012, the start of the academic year. This small number soon increased to 30, once local parents' interests in the school had grown.







By May 2013, the school's popularity increased and many more of the village parents added their children's names to the growing waiting list. This was followed by Phase 2 of the HAPC Gambia Village School – the construction of 2 additional classrooms and an office, and a further 60 children were welcomed in the new school term.





In January 2014, the Gambian Government heard about the HAPC Village School project and supported the initiative following a visit to the school by a Minister. Construction of Phase 3 soon commenced and by the beginning of the new term in September 2014, another intake of children were welcomed into the school.

Today, a total of 132 children are studying at the HAPC Gambia Village School, thanks to your generous support of our fundraising initiatives.

Our plans for the future development of the school will depend on additional funds raised, however, for the moment, our main priority is to raise £5,000 per year to provide much needed support and maintenance of the school. That's just £40 a year for each child.



As a result, HELP A POOR CHILD has now launched a Pledge Campaign, in the hope that we can get some of our supporters to help us secure the future of the school by making a minimum monthly financial pledge of just **£4 per month**. If you can help, do please let us know and we will send you some additional information.
